#### **COMPLETE SENTENCES AND FRAGMENTS**

A <u>complete sentence</u> is a group of words that <u>expresses</u> a <u>complete thought</u>. A <u>sentence needs</u> a <u>subject and a predicate</u>. Without a <u>subject</u> and a predicate, a <u>sentence</u> is incomplete.

#### **Fragment**

A **fragment** is an **incomplete sentence** that is missing a subject, a predicate, or both.

**Example:** When I was home alone.

#### **Simple Sentences**

A simple sentences states one complete thought.

**Example:** My mother went out. I was home alone.

#### **Compound Sentences**

A **compound sentence** is made up of **two or more simple sentences joined together**. One way to join simple sentences is by **using a comma and a coordinating conjunction**.

**Example:** My mother went out, and I was home alone.

It often begins with a subordinating conjunction such as when, because, or as.
